The ESCO Foundation is able to provide grants that support our communities and employees in a variety of ways. We give approximately \$300,000 annually in support of our core charities, which are located across the U.S in areas where we have operations. We provide miscellaneous grants of up to \$1,000 in support organizations where our employees are actively involved or through which they have received valued services. In addition, we are able to provide scholarships to the children of employees and hardship grants that support employees who are facing extremely challenging circumstances.

In June, the 2022 ESCO Technologies Foundation scholarships were awarded. Including the eleven scholarships awarded this year, the Foundation has now given 159 scholarships, totaling over \$450,000.





Ventura County Search and Rescue

PTI has chosen a new core charity to support this year. The Ventura County Search and Rescue East Valley Team 3 (VCSAR3) responds to public safety and wilderness emergencies throughout Ventura County and the state of California. The team is comprised of highly dedicated and skilled volunteers, including PTI employee Kevin Smart. They are on call twenty-four hours a day and provide their services free of charge to anyone who needs help. In 2021, they volunteered over 5,600 hours in the community.

VCSAR3 relies on donations to cover their annual operating costs. When the team responds to calls for help in the backcountry, they need to be prepared with the proper equipment. Our Foundation grant of \$14,000 was used to purchase rugged and durable Arcteryx Ski Guide jackets. They replaced equipment that was at least 15 years old and no longer provided protection from the elements.
