In 2023 the ESCO Technologies Foundation gave over \$367,000 in grants to support charitable organizations, scholarships, and employee hardship cases. During the year we gave \$278,000 in grants to our core charities, which are organizations that we typically support on a recurring basis with annual donations. We awarded \$44,000 in scholarships to the children of fourteen ESCO employees. In addition, we gave a record \$29,000 in miscellaneous grants to support organizations where our employees are personally involved with volunteering and fundraising and \$16,000 in grants to support members of our workforce that are facing extreme hardships. Core Charities

VACCO Industries



The Foundation's initial donation to South El Monte Community Outreach (SEMCO) was to provide food assistance to lowincome families during the pandemic. Since that time SEMCO has become a core charity for VACCO. SEMCO operates within the city government of South El Monte and VACCO works with the Mayor's office to provide help where it is needed most. In 2023, the Foundation provided \$20,000 in grants which supported various community programs including backpacks filled with school supplies, breakfast for the homeless, food baskets for families, lunch for local law enforcement, and support for various other community events.

In addition, VACCO was able to sponsor the distribution of turkeys during the Thanksgiving season and was presented with a certificate of appreciation from the Mayor for their efforts to support local families during the holiday season, noting that their kindness and commitment to the community is making a difference.





ESCO Corporate



In 2023, the Foundation added City League as a core charity. We are in a time when schools are facing teacher shortages and funding cuts, while consistently being called upon to meet the increasing social, emotional, and learning needs of students. City League was founded in 2021 and partners with middle schools in the city of St. Louis to provide high quality school sports and extracurricular activities. They are only in Phase 1 of a 10-year impact plan, and are already working with 12 middle schools, offering 600 students access to 4 sports opportunities (cross country, volleyball, basketball, and soccer) during the academic year.

City League believes that participation in school sports has positive impacts both in and outside the classroom and that lowincome families often lack access to high quality sports and extracurricular activities. 87% of City League program participants were playing a team sport for the first time. A post season survey of 262 families with students participating in the program found that 90% were more academically motivated, 88% said their athletes strengthened relationships with friends and peers, 88% noted improved self-esteem, and 80% said behavior and leadership in school improved. In 2023, our \$5,000 Foundation grant helped pay for the cost of soccer referees for the season.









Holiday Giving

During the 2023 holiday season, ESCO corporate supported two local organizations – Places for People and Toys for Tots.

Places for People is a behavioral health services organization that provides a portfolio of health and social services to those in need in St. Louis. To support Places for People, ESCO corporate adopted a family with four children for the holidays. Each department supported a child by collecting donations and shopping for items on wish lists provided by the family which included clothes, shoes, and toys. In addition, the Foundation donated \$1,000 to Places for People.







Gifts were also collected to support the local Marine Toys for Tots campaign. Two marines stopped by to collect the toys and joined us for a holiday breakfast.







2024 Scholarship Program

Information and applications for the 2024 ESCO Technologies Foundation Scholarship program were recently distributed and are also available within the UKG platform.

We are pleased to announce that in 2024 we are increasing the one-year scholarship award to \$5,000 (from \$3,000). In addition, we are expanding scholarship eligibility from children and step-children, to now include grandchildren of full or part-time U.S. employees of ESCO Technologies and its domestic subsidiaries.

Since program inception, 173 scholarships totaling \$518,250 have been awarded. Scholarships will be awarded to up to 25% of the total number of applicants and the announcement of scholarship awards will be made by early June.

The applications are divided into two pools:

- Pool 1 for students attending four-year colleges/universities or pursuing postgraduate studies
- Pool 2 for students attending Community or Junior Colleges and Trade, Vocational or Technical schools.

All scholarship applications must be submitted electronically in a single PDF document via email to scholarship@escotechnologies.com. The application deadline is April 30, 2024. An email will be sent to each applicant confirming receipt of their application. If an applicant does not receive a confirmation email, they should contact Kate Lowrey at 314-213-7243.
